#### CITY ADMINISTRATOR REPORT

In lieu of having to complete significant necessary upgrades (contractor bid cost was approximately \$7.5 million) to the City's former Fremont Street wastewater plant, the City joined the Rib Mountain Metropolitan Sewerage District (RMMSD) in October 2011 for the purpose of treating of our municipal wastewater. After thorough consideration, it was concluded that opting to join the regional RMMSD facility offered the most advantageous long-term solution for treating our municipal wastewater, rather than rehabbing the City's existing wastewater treatment plant. The major benefit of participating in the regional treatment facility is that the municipal members of the RMMSD share the cost of operating and maintaining a single wastewater treatment plant, which is much more economical than each community operating their own facility individually. The RMMSD currently consists of the following five (5) municipalities: the Village of Weston, the Village of Rothschild, the Village of Kronenwetter, the Village of Rib Mountain and the City of Mosinee. The City began sending our municipal wastewater to the RMMSD treatment facility which is located across the Wisconsin River from the Weston Power Plant in October 2012.

The Rib Mountain Metropolitan Sewerage District is now planning to begin an estimated \$22 million upgrade to their treatment facility this spring. This project entails the replacement of treatment equipment that is reaching the end of its designed "life" and the integration of new treatment technology to help comply with environmental standards, including the removal of phosphorus.

As a direct result of this project, the City will need to increase our sewer utility service rates to cover our share of the debt service expenses for the RMMSD facility upgrade project. We are anticipating that the City's sewer utility rates will be increasing by 20% effective with the February utility billing period. For a family of four that uses 4,000 gallons of water per month, the sewer portion of your monthly city utility bill will increase approximately \$7.64 as a result of the sewer rate increase.

Due to significant inflationary expenses (e.g.: chemical cost increases) related to the City's water utility system, the City is also anticipating that the water utility service rates will be increasing by 3% effective with the May utility billing period. For a family of four that uses 4,000 gallons of water per month, the water portion of your monthly city utility bill will increase approximately \$1.40 as a result of the water rate increase.

The City's water and sewer utility rates were last increased in April 2022.

# **NOTICE - DOG/CAT OWNERS**

Dogs and Cats are required to be licensed by March 31<sup>st</sup>, 2024. The license period runs from January 1<sup>st</sup>, 2024 to December 31<sup>st</sup>, 2024. State law requires that all dogs must be licensed <u>yearly</u> AND City ordinances require cats to be licensed yearly. Before a license can be issued, you must furnish a rabies vaccination certificate to show proof of vaccination against rabies.
