I am pleased to bring you this monthly update from the Mayor's Office and City Hall. I hope your summer is going well.

It has been an exciting past month in Mosinee. If you have not already noticed, I am pleased to announce that the new Cobblestone Hotel is now open for business in downtown Mosinee. The new 54 unit, four story hotel came to fruition thanks to the trust and confidence that its owners placed in our community.

We are also thankful to the Wisconsin Economic Development Corporation for its support for the project. As I have mentioned in the past, the Wisconsin Economic Development Corporation has made multiple investments in our community, including the Mosinee Brewing Company and bounce back grants following the COVID-19 pandemic.

Relatedly, I was pleased to welcome the Deputy Secretary and other staff from the Wisconsin Economic Development Corporation to Mosinee in early June to tour several of our local businesses, including the hotel, Lamplight Sessions, Brightside Nutrition, the Mosinee Brewing Company, and Created Anew Designs. The visitors were very impressed with all that is happening in our community.

June was also an opportunity for me to join others in celebrating the one-year anniversary of another new Mosinee business – Lamplight Sessions, also home to the Mission Coffee House. Lamplight Sessions owner has done a beautiful job renovating the building on Main Street adjacent the new hotel and in bringing traveling musicians through our community for everyone's entertainment.

In other news, our June Mosinee Common Council meeting was an opportunity to welcome a new member to the Council and thank one of our outgoing members for his service to our community. Mark Viau joined the Council for his first meeting as 5th Ward Alderperson. Former 5th Ward Alderperson Pete Nievinski was also in attendance to accept recognition of the Council's appreciation for his service. While Pete is leaving the Council, he will continue to serve us on the Planning Commission.

Finally, in more exciting news, I am pleased to announce that the City is the proud recipient of a \$50,000 grant from the State of Wisconsin to be used for improvements in and around Square Park in downtown Mosinee. The City achieved the grant as part of a program administered by the Wisconsin Economic Development Corporation to revive and create vibrant spaces. The City intends to make lighting upgrades to the park, add a wall mural on the brick façade facing the park, and renovate a storage barn in the adjacent parking lot for community use.

In closing, I would like to thank the Mosinee Area Chamber of Commerce for all of its hard work toward the 4th of July festivities hosted in and around River Park. The 4th of July festivities in Mosinee have always been some of the best and are a great way to showcase our community.

BRUSH PICKUP SERVICE

The City of Mosinee provides brush pickup service for City residents.

The brush must be cut into lengths less than 6' long and piled neatly.

Any brush that has roots attached will not be picked up.

Brush will not be picked up for residents that are clearing a lot. Brush and tree limbs are picked up the third week of each month.

To have your brush picked up, call 715-693-3840, before the 3rd Monday, leave your name, address, and location of the branches.
