## Spring Cleanup Information

Spring Cleanup is scheduled for April 29<sup>th</sup> thru May 2<sup>nd</sup>

**All items must be dropped off at the City Garage, 1101 Main St.**

- Wednesday, April 29<sup>th</sup> thru May 1<sup>st</sup> – 7:00a.m. to 7:00p.m.
- Saturday, May 2<sup>nd</sup> – 7:00a.m. to 1:00p.m.

This collection program is for **City Residents only! No commercial/industrial items will be accepted.**

**Items that will be accepted at no charge include:** Computer printers, computer processing units (keyboards-CPU's-monitors), couches, chairs, beds, windows, boards, carpeting, building materials, water heaters, microwaves, washers, dryers, dishwashers, bicycles, humidifiers, and rimless tires. Call the number below if you are unsure about an item.

**The following items will also be accepted on Saturday – (These items will also be accepted Wednesday thru Friday if paid in advance at City Hall)**

**For each of the following items dropped off, you will be charged \$15:** Refrigerators, welders, dehumidifiers, freezers, air conditioners, television sets, water coolers, ice machines, VCR, DVR and L.P. tanks.

**Tire disposal. Residents will need to stop at City Hall and obtain a voucher for tire disposal. Voucher must be presented at the collection site before any tires will be accepted. A limit of 4 tires per address will be allowed.**

**For the disposal of fluorescent light bulbs, we will be charging \$1 per bulb.**

**Items that will not be accepted include:** Leaves, brush, yard waste, newspapers, plastics, hazardous materials, paint, household garbage and recyclables.

Dear Mosinee Residents & Business Owners:

Before getting into this month's updates, I want to take a moment to recognize the passing of former Mayor Peter Nievinski. Pete cared about this community and served it well. We're grateful for his time and commitment, and we extend our condolences to his family.

I am pleased to share some exciting developments and updates from our City of Mosinee.

At the April 1st meeting, the City Plan Commission reviewed two commercial development projects that will be considered by the City Common Council at their regular meeting on April 13th:

- American Asphalt of Wisconsin is planning to construct a 4,812-square-foot addition to their office building in the Central Wisconsin Business Park. American Asphalt was the first business to build in the Business Park, and we are thrilled to see their continued investment in Mosinee, further strengthening our local economy.
- United Development Group of Green Bay, Wisconsin, is proposing to demolish the three homes located on the south side of East Highway 153, just east of O'Reilly Auto Parts, to make way for a new 9,100-square-foot retail store that would be fully occupied by Dollar General. This project aligns with the City's Tax Increment District No. 3, which was specifically expanded in April 2021 to encourage redevelopment of these properties into new commercial uses.

In other City news:

- The City's Department of Public Works is overseeing engineering work for the reconstruction of 3rd Street, from Main Street north to Buchanan Street, which is scheduled for this summer.
- The Annual City Spring Cleanup will take place from Wednesday, April 29, through 1:00 PM on Saturday, May 2. We encourage all residents to take advantage of this service to dispose of unwanted items—especially construction debris and other outdoor-stored materials—and help keep Mosinee clean and well maintained.
