OPEN ICE SKATE HOURS

Dessert Park (Mosinee)–Outdoor Ice Rink–Open Skate Hours-800 West 4th St
The City will soon be opening our Outdoor Ice Rink at Dessert Park (weather permitting). During these times, we generally have the Dessert Park Lodge open unless the rink is closed due to weather conditions: **Mon/Wed/Friday:** 4:00 p.m. to 6:00 p.m. Hockey & Free Skating, 6:00 p.m. to 8:00 p.m. Free Skating Only, **Tuesday/Thursday:** 4:00 p.m. to 6:00 p.m. Free Skating Only 6:00 p.m.to 8:00 p.m. Hockey & Free Skating, **Saturday/Sunday:** 1:00 p.m.to 4:30 p.m. Free Skating Only 4:30 p.m.to 6:00 p.m. Hockey & Free Skating. There is no charge to use the ice during our open skate hours.

Did you know.....The City has a sled hill for younger children which is located next to the City Garage in River Park. When parking your car in the area, please do not park in front of any of the doors of the City Garage/Outbuildings. There is no charge to use the sled hill.

Secure Your Mailbox

Reminder to Check Your Mailbox Before Snowplowing Season Please inspect your mailbox and post to insure that it is installed properly. Just a reminder to make sure mail boxes are sturdy and able to withstand the force of plowed snow. Make sure the posts are solid in the ground, and boxes will not pop off if a pile of snow is pushed against it. Rotted wood posts and rusted steel posts will not withstand the weight of snow being pushed against them. Plow Operators are instructed to be cautious near mail boxes. In most cases a properly installed mail box will permit a snow plow to clear snow around it. Most cases of damaged mail boxes are caused by heavy snow hitting the box. The mail boxes are not usually hit by the plow. A mailbox with alleged damage from a direct hit by a City snow plow must be reported immediately and will be visually inspected by City staff. It is the policy of the City to only reimburse the owner for mail boxes broken from coming in direct contact with the plow.

Office of the Mayor – Municipal Briefing

Dear Mosinee Residents & Business Owners:

As we welcome the New Year, I would like to wish you and your family a happy, healthy, and prosperous year ahead! The coming months bring several important projects as we continue investing in our community and planning for the future.

During this month, the City Plan Commission and Common Council will consider the final plat for a new 56-lot residential subdivision located on the north side of Maple Ridge Road. The River on Maple Ridge Subdivision will consist of 28 single-family lots and 28 twin-home (duplex) lots, featuring zero-lot-line designs to promote homeownership.

The City's Department of Public Works is planning for the reconstruction of 3rd Street from Main Street north to Buchanan Street. This much-needed project will improve the roadway conditions, and I am pleased to share that it will be supported in part by financial assistance from a State Local Road Improvement Program grant. Securing these funds helps reduce the burden on local taxpayers while allowing us to make critical infrastructure improvements.

The City Common Council will also begin discussions on the most beneficial long-term use of the former *BMO* property located on Main Street. These conversations will explore options for private redevelopment as well as potential public uses, with the goal of ensuring the property contributes positively to our downtown and community as a whole.

In addition, we are preparing to begin installation of new playground equipment at the new Maple Ridge Park this summer. This project is made possible with very generous assistance from area foundations, and we are continuing to pursue additional grant funding to expand the playground with even more equipment in the future. These improvements will help create a welcoming, family-friendly space for residents of all ages to enjoy.

As winter weather continues, I would like to offer a friendly reminder to residents and business owners to shovel the public sidewalks adjacent to their property when practicable. Keeping sidewalks clear helps ensure safe passage for pedestrians of all ages.

Thank you for your continued support, and I look forward to a great year ahead as we work together to strengthen our community.
