Where to Vote:

- District 1 – Wards 1,2, 6, 7, 8 City Hall – 225 Main Street
- District 2 – Ward 3, 4 and 5 WI National Guard Armory – 1000 Jackson St

Sample ballots will be available for viewing on our City website. Absentee ballots are available for anyone that is unwilling or unable to vote at the poll site locations on Election Day. - Additions
- Upgrades to electrical & plumbing services
- Garages and sheds
- Interior Remodeling (new walls, bathroom upgrades, kitchen upgrades, finishing basement, etc)
- Siding
- Decks, Patios, Porches
- Fences, Driveways, and Swimming pools
- Moving existing buildings into the City
- Roofing (No charge for permit – permit required)

Building Permits are not required in the City of Mosinee for the following projects:

- Replacement of Windows, Doors

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CITY ADMINISTRATOR REPORT

I am pleased to report that at its February 17, 2026 meeting, the City's Parks & Recreation Commission approved a quotation for the purchase and installation of Phase I of the playground equipment at Maple Ridge Park. The park is located at the west end of Maple View Drive on the City's north side.

This spring, a new large modular play structure—shown in the lower portion of the rendering below—will be installed. The structure will feature multiple climbing elements designed to provide hours of fun and active play for our young residents.



Maple Ridge Park serves residents of four existing residential subdivisions and an apartment development in the Maple Ridge Road area. The park will also support residents of The River on Maple Ridge Subdivision, which is expected to begin construction later this spring.

The Phase I playground improvements are made possible through generous grant funding from the *B.A. & Esther Greenheck Foundation*, the *Dudley Foundation*, and a *Wausau–Marathon County Impact Grant* awarded through the *Community Foundation of North Central Wisconsin*.

The City will continue seeking additional grant opportunities to help fund Phase II of the park playground project. Planned improvements for this phase include a ZipVenture feature, swings, a toddler play structure, and a basketball court.
